Indigenous History & Culture in Canada concludes with four appendices:

- Indigenous Population Statistics
- Treaty Territories Map and Summaries
- Language Family Maps and Distribution
- Chronological Maps of Territorial Change

The appendices are followed by a Bibliography collecting all the sources listed in each essay and an easy-to-use Subject Index of important terms, concepts, and individuals mentioned throughout the text.

Indigenous History & Culture in Canada is an excellent resource for anyone interested in gaining detailed insight into Indigenous traditions and history, from a historical context through to modern culture and the pressing issues facing the Indigenous peoples of Canada today.
